In July 2021 ACSR, submitted an Expression of Interest to Rural Perth & Kinross LEADER Local Action Group (LAG) for funding to facilitate a CAP for Auchterarder. As the lead local organisation, ACSR were able to initiate the process, supported by Sharon Rice Jones, Rural P&K LEADER, and Lesley Campbell from Small Towns and Rural (STAR) Development

ACSR took this opportunity to review and revise our 2021-24 Development Plan and getting to know Ang Laurie, as Community Connector, has a been a huge privilege.

One of the major outcomes for ACSR from the this 'Journey', has been greatly improved communication and contact with Senior Management within PKC, resulting in significant progress in the redevelopment of the Public Park. After nearly six years of delays and frustration, it is now finally happening with the Children's Play Park the first stage of construction.

This will be immediately followed by a fully funded Pump Track and Mountain Bike Skills Trail, with an Official Opening planned for early June 2023.

Tim in his role as DM, has ensured that ACSR continues to be professional in all aspects of governance, management, and the operation of our Charity. He has continued to build good relationships with Trustees, our Working Groups, **sport**scotland, funders, PKC, A&A CAP, volunteers and many Clubs and organisations from across our community.

Gemma Simpson and Tim make a great Team and I personally thank them for their patience and support as I navigate my way through appraisals, development plans and other areas of line management.

All this would not be possible without the hard work of our many volunteers who regularly donate their time and skills to support ACSR.
